1 Quick Start Guide for ezEdit

In order to get started using ezEdit quickly, you can review this document and follow the steps outlined. This document provides the basic information to get started – for more complete details on functionality and usage, refer to the ezEdit help file or printed documentation.

This guide assumes that ezEdit has been installed on your PC and that you are ready to use the software.


1.1 Step 1 - Launch ezEdit

From your PC's Start Menu, select **Programs | ezEdit**. ezEdit will start up. A splash screen will appear and if ezEdit is not yet registered, a notice regarding registration.




Click [OK] to continue if the registration notice appears.

In order to use ezEdit, you must define at least one station in preferences. Select the menu item **Edit** | **Preferences** from the main menu, as shown.



1.2 Step 2 - Setup a Station


Before using ezEdit, you need to define at least one station for which you will edit and/or create logs. To do so, select the **Edit | Preferences** menu item on the main display. The preferences dialog will appear, with the **Stations** tab displayed. Click on the "+" button on the stations tool bar, located near the bottom of the display.



The text cursor will be placed in the **Station Name** field. Type in a name for the station - the name is used for identification purposes within ezEdit and can be anything you like.

Finish filling in the rest of the information about the station, including the call letters, the station number, path to log files and the inventory information. You can get help on what each field is for and what is needed by clicking on the [**Help**] button located on the right side of the dialog.

When you have finished filling in the information, click on the "**Post Edit**" button, which appears as a check mark on the toolbar, as shown:



After posting the station information, the [**Apply**] button should be enabled, allowing you to apply (save) your changes to the station information.




When you click on the **[Apply]** button, ezEdit validates the station information you entered and will inform you if there problems with the information, including incorrect paths, missing inventory files, etc.

At this point, you could close the preferences dialog and begin working with logs. If that's what you wish to do, skip steps 3 and 4, moving directly to step 5.

1.3 Step 3 - Create a Cart Category

A useful feature of ezEdit is the ability to filter cart numbers in the inventory display, reducing the number of items to search through if you want to add a cart to the log by dragging it from the inventory. You can also assign colors to a cart category, which is covered later in this topic.

To create a cart category, select the *Cart Categories* tab in preferences.



Click on the "+" button to create a new cart filter. You'll be prompted to enter a name for the category.




Type in a name - this can be any name you wish. The name is displayed in ezEdit for choosing the category. Press the [Enter] key. Another dialog will pop up, asking you to enter a cart mask, as shown.



For this example, we have used a cart mask of "T???", which means "all carts beginning with the letter "T". For more information on cart masks, you can click on the [Help] button. You can have multiple cart masks for each cart filter, but for demonstration purposes, one is enough.

When you have entered the cart mask, click on the [OK] button.

The cart filter and its associated cart mask will now appear in the cart filter list and the [Apply] button will be enabled, allowing you to save your changes.




If you don't wish to set up anything else, click on the [**Apply**] button, then the [**Close**] button, and skip to step 5.


Cart Category Colors

An optional but handy feature is the ability to define text and background colors for each of the cart categories that you define. The colors you select will be applied to the log display for each audio item matching the masks in the cart category. By using distinctive color combinations, you can more easily spot commercial clusters, for instance.


The following screen shots shows the sequence of assigning text and background colors to the cart category we defined for spots:




Selecting a text color from the drop-down list

Selecting background color from the drop-down list




Text and background color selection complete

You'll notice that as you assign text and background colors, a preview panel displays the result so you get an immediate sense of what the color combination will look like when used to display matching log records.

1.4 Step 4 - Enable Double-Click Log Selection

Before we finish our abbreviated work with application preferences, we're going to do one last thing - enable the ability to double-click in the Open Log Dialog to make selecting a log for editing easier.


Select the *User Interface* tab. Then "check" the item called **Enable Double-Click Open Log Dialog**, as shown:



Click on the [Apply] button to save your changes, then click on the [Close] button to close the preferences display.


1.5 Step 5 - Open a Log for Editing

We're now ready to open a log for editing. From the main dialog, select the menu item **File | Open Log**. A dialog will appear, showing the station name you've defined and a calendar that's marked up on dates where logs exist for the selected station. If you defined more than one station, you can use the drop-down list to select the station of your choice. The calendar will be updated to reflect the logs that exist for the newly-selected station.



To select a log, simply double-click on the date you want (if you enabled the feature in Preferences) – or, select the date (the day will appear as a depressed button) and click on the [**OK**] button.

The log will be loaded and displayed in a window in the main dialog.



The example display shows the effect of assigning cart category colors - each type of audio file is readily discernable by its distinctive color combination.
